Basic and Advanced KISSsys Training

KISSsys is a powerful tool to model and analyze entire transmission systems. With the help of KISSsys your design process will increase in speed and reliability. There is no more manual data exchange needed between the single calculation modules or different programs. The results of all gearbox calculations will be available in an overview, even for different operating conditions. Modeling with KISSsys allows you to produce 3D models of the new design at the very early stage of the process.

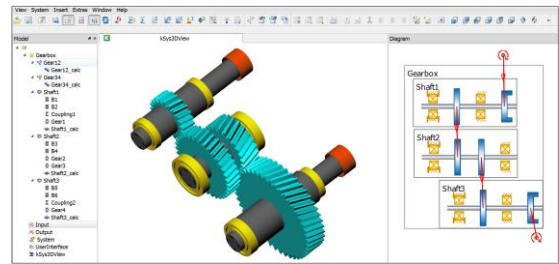
The training is divided in three parts. The first part “Modeling gearboxes” allows you to get started with KISSsys. During the two days you will get to know the interface of KISSsys and learn about modeling points and designing your first simple gearboxes. Thereafter, being the second part, you will be introduced to system calculations with KISSsys and KISSsoft by using various templates and analysis possibilities. The third part deals with the customization of finished models including the import and export possibilities. You will also see how to run KISSsys without using the graphical user interface.

The training course is aimed for engineers working in the field of gearbox calculation. The goal is to give users the knowledge on how to get started with KISSsys, learning about its scope and possibilities, so that participants can use the software for their specific applications in a more efficient way after the training.

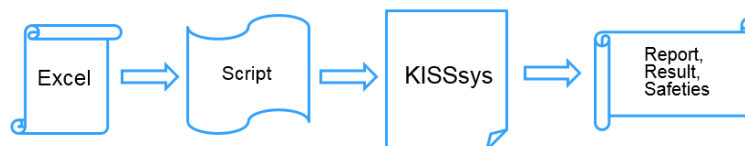
